Canadian Glass Association (CGA) Report

May 3rd 2011

To: PGAA / GAMA

The CGA Board of Directors held their last meeting / Conference call on May 2, 2011 in Toronto.

Richard Neal, (PGAA President) was present and Stephen Hargrove (CGA Director) participated by phone.

President Richard Verdon called the meeting to order at 1:00 PM Eastern time at the Delta Chelsea Hotel, Toronto Ontario.

Regional Reports were heard from Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia Glass Associations. Richard Verdon gave updates on Manitoba, Atlantic Canada and Quebec.

Ontario is hosting the Glass Connections May 3 and this has been their main focus of attention. Ontario Glass & Metal Association (OGMA) has arranged a social night out to the horse race track May 2nd to their members and those in attendance for Glass Connections.

Stephen Hargrove and Richard Neal (PGAA) reported on activities in Alberta such as the recent election and AGM meeting March 16th in Red Deer, PGAA Golf Tournament, Scholarship funding, SAIT and Master Glaziers program and Glass Connections 2011 Edmonton.

David Langton (GCA) British Columbia brought a copy of the current rewritten Specifications Manual. It has all the updated National Codes and is ready for distribution in PDF format. He also mentioned the Glaziers apprenticeship program in BC is being reworked and that there were some funding issues.

Richard Verdon said he was recently in Manitoba and had meetings in Winnipeg with some glazing contractors and suppliers who will be forming a Glass Association that will be in place shortly and once in place they intend to join the CGA. Richard is also going to Atlantic Canada in June 2011 to meet with interested glass companies and to form an Association. Quebec is organizing a commercial Glass Association also and Richard will have more information on this in the months to come.

There was a motion passed and seconded and carried that the CGA pay the Glazing Contactors Association Of British Columbia a fee of \$50.00 per copy of the current Glazing Specifications Manual for the next 5 years. After which the full distribution and copyright agreement would be turned over to the Canadian Glass Association.

The Glass Connections Edmonton was discussed and it was decided that it should be held in October on the 25th or 27th depending on availability of Hotel Conference venue. Zana Gordon will be contacting the Delta South on Gateway Blvd. to check rates etc. Richard Neal and Stephen Hargrove will assist with organizing this event.
