Certification Process

I felt it necessary to prepare this report to document the certification process used in 2005 so that the future of the "Certificate of Leadership" program can only be improved upon.

1. Questionnaires – 15 companies had submitted their questionnaires for accreditation. The committee spent some time going over these submittals and determining certification for the four categories.
2. During this process certain qualifications were determined.
 - **GAMA commitment:** Accreditation requires attendance of at least two times in the past twelve month period. (I would like to challenge this at the Executive Meeting)
 - **Technical training:** You will need to show continued upgrading in a twelve month period.
 - **Apprenticeship:** Support would be interpreted as showing continued involvement in the apprenticeship program at SAIT. An example of that would be best described as promoting the program with apprentices. If you have all Journeymen working for you, it doesn't necessarily mean you are continuing support to the apprenticeship program.
 - **Safety:** Will require yearly updates and certificates showing continued training.
3. Suppliers are not able to meet the qualifications for the Apprenticeship portion of the certificate. For these members of GAMA three certifiable designs will be on the certificate instead of four.

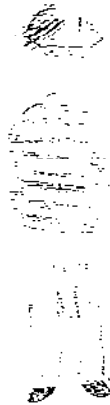

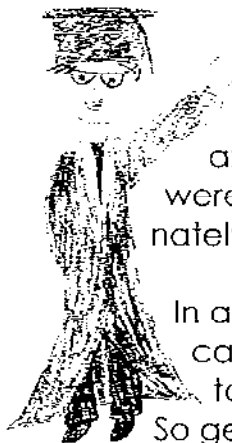
